An FIR was filed at DN Nagar Police Station after two unidentified men allegedly deceived Constable Altab Karim Beldar and took a seized white Suzuki Burgman scooter (MH 03 ET 9419) on August 14. The scooter, impounded on August 10 for a missing number plate, belonged to Anas Khan's wife, Shabina. The men, posing as relatives, paid a Rs2,000 fine via QR code and retrieved the vehicle. On August 18, Khan denied knowing the men shown in CCTV footage.

A 40-year-old Vasai man, a senior employee in Malad, was defrauded of Rs1.08 crore by a scammer met via a matrimonial app in September. After gaining his trust, the scammer introduced a fraudulent currency trading website and app. From September 29 to October 13, the victim transferred Rs1.08 crore in nine transactions. When he attempted to withdraw earnings, the scammer demanded Rs28 lakh in taxes. Realizing the fraud, he reported it online. MB-VV police registered a case under cheating and IT Act provisions, using the scammer's contact number, website link, and transaction details for investigation.

Mumbai's Art Deco heritage, among the largest in the world after Miami, is being celebrated through an exhibition titled 'From Marine Drive to Ocean Drive', which opens on November 7. Organised by Art Deco Alive!, Art Deco Mumbai Trust, and Dr Bhau Daji Lad Museum as knowledge partners and collaborators, the exhibition traces the evolution and endurance of Mumbai's Art Deco style in its centenary year. Curated by Atul Kumar, the display features multimedia, archival photographs, oral history accounts, and rare artefacts and furniture from private collections. The exhibition debuted in Miami before travelling to city.

Art Deco influenced architecture, interiors, furniture, neon lighting, typography, fashion, and even cinema posters. To expand understanding of the style, the event will include a museum show, speaker series, guided walks, film screenings, cinema tours, and workshops on sketching, typography, jazz, fashion, and jewellery. At the inauguration, Ashish Shelar said heritage appreciation begins when society engages with the stories embedded in its built environment. Bhushan Gargani stressed that preserving Art Deco precincts remains a collective responsibility. Smiti Kanodia and Tasneem Zakaria Mehta highlighted protecting spaces that hold the city's cultural identity.

The Mumbai Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) has registered an FIR in connection with a large-scale housing fraud involving the Sky 31 project in Wadala (West), alleging that the developers misappropriated around Rs100 crore collected from flat purchasers.

According to police, the FIR has been registered at RAK Marg Police Station under

Sections 420 (cheating), 406 (criminal breach of trust), and 34 (common intention) of the Indian Penal Code following a preliminary inquiry.

The complaint was filed by Anil Mohanlal Dron, 62, a chartered accountant residing at Kandivali (West). The accused have been identified as Subbaraman Anand Vilayanur, Uma Subbaraman, BP Ganger Constructions Pvt Ltd, and other unidentified persons.

The alleged fraud took

place between 2018 and the present. The EOW police said the accused, in connivance with each other, collected around Rs100 crore from 102 homebuyers under the pretext of constructing flats in the

At least 17 senior officials of the civic body have jointly opposed retired Deputy Municipal Commissioner Chandrashekhar Chore continuing in a key post, insisting it belongs to their cadre. In a letter to Municipal Commissioner Bhushan Gagrani, they argued that keeping the post vacant has stalled promotions from assistant to deputy commissioner, creating “a sense of injustice” among eligible candidates. Chore retired as Deputy Municipal Commissioner (Commissioner’s Office) on December 31, 2024, but his tenure was extended for another year, ending next month. This caused discontent among senior officials, who believe the vacancy should have been filled internally.

The joint letter, signed by Deputy and Joint Commissioners, noted the post has been vacant for two years and urged filling it from within the ranks of Deputy Commissioner, Joint Commissioner, or Assistant Commissioner. The officials said external appointments have stalled promotions, causing widespread dissatisfaction. Gagrani declined to comment. Choro stated, "I have always followed administrative decisions and will do that now too."

In a significant step towards reducing food wastage and stabilising agricultural markets, Maharashtra is set to introduce advanced foreign technology capable of extending the shelf life of perishable products. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has begun discussions with companies from Germany and Japan to bring this technology to India, with a MoU expected soon.

According to FDA Minister Narhari Zirwal, the initiative will benefit farmers, consumers, and the food industry by ensuring that agricultural produce remains fresh for longer and reaches markets in better condition. Farmers often face losses due to

sudden gluts that lead to price crashes, and the lack of adequate storage facilities results in large quantities of produce being spoiled. Zirwal said the proposed technology would help break this cycle by preserving the quality of goods for extended periods.

The minister recently visited Germany to study advanced food storage and shelf-life enhancement methods. He said the visit helped the state understand how similar models could be adapted to Indian conditions. The new technology is expected to maintain freshness, prevent spoilage, and reduce wastage on a large scale. Officials said the technology can keep ready-to-eat items like chapatis fresh for up to six months, while onions and fruits can be preserved for six to eight months.

## A bench scheduled the hearing for December 5

After nearly a decade, the Bombay High Court on Thursday said it will hear in December actor **Amol Palekar's** petition seeking protection of artistic freedom and challenging the mandatory pre-censorship of plays and dramas.

A bench of Justices Riyaz Chagla and Farhan Dubash scheduled the hearing for December 5 after Palekar's counsel, Anil Anturkar, requested that the 2016 petition be finally taken up. "The petitioner is 85 years old now and wants an outcome, be it positive or negative," Anturkar told the court.

The counsel said the limited issue before the court is whether, under the provisions of the Bombay Police Act, the police have the authority to impose pre-censorship on plays and performances. "We are now in an era where there is no censorship of shows and series on OTT platforms," he argued.

In his petition, Palekar has challenged the rules framed under Section 33(1)(wa) of the Bombay Police Act, which empower the Commissioner or Superintendent of Police to regulate “places of public amusement” and “performances for public amusement” — including plays, tamashas and melas.

The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Mumbai Police arrested Sandeep Babulal Gada, 39, a furniture and plywood businessman from Andheri (West), in a crores financial fraud case. Registered under multiple Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023 sections, including cheating, forgery, and criminal conspiracy, Gada was detained after evidence linked him to fraudulent transactions. He will be produced before the Esplanade court on Friday. The EOW is probing the financial trail and other associates.

VP Road Police registered a case against Pushpendra Manmal Angara for defrauding businessman Ritesh Ramlal Angara of rs.24.4 crore. Pushpendra falsely claimed ownership of Ritesh's firm, Kartik Ferromet Pvt Ltd, and diverted funds to fake company accounts. He induced payments from companies for metal sales, then withdrew the money for personal gain. An FIR under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita for cheating and criminal breach of trust has been filed, with police tracing the diverted funds.
